

## How does God speak to you and lead you?

- How did the angel communicate to Philip to go to the desert? A vision, dream, trance, or visitation? (Acts 8:26)
- How did the Holy Spirit communicate to Philip to approach the chariot? A prompting? (Acts 8:29)
- The Lord spoke to Ananias in a vision (Acts 9:10-11)
- The Lord spoke to Saul in a vision (Acts 9:12)
- The Lord used an angel in a vision to speak to Cornelius, while he was fasting and praying (Acts 10:3,5)
- The Lord spoke to Peter in a trance in a vision (Acts 10:9,10)
- How did the Holy Spirit tell Peter to go with the messengers from Cornelius? (Acts 10:19-20)
- How did God prompt Barnabas to seek Saul in Tarsus and bring him back to Antioch, since that was not part of his mission (Acts 11:25-26)
- The Holy Spirit spoke to send out Barnabas and Saul to preach to the Gentiles. How did the Spirit reveal this? (Acts 13:2-3)
- The Lord instructed Paul in a vision at night to go to Europe and preach (Acts 16:9-10)
- How did Jesus visit Paul to encourage and tell him he was going to bear witness at Rome? (Acts 23:11)
- What does it mean that John was in the Spirit when Jesus appeared to him, on Patmos? Jesus prophesied to seven churches, about what was going on in each of them uniquely and intimately, through John. John was to send these prophecies with messengers back to the churches. (Rev 1:10-12)

## Verses:

- “Now an angel of the Lord spoke to Philip, saying, Arise and go toward the south along the road which goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza. This is desert.” (Acts 8:26)
- “Then the Spirit said to Philip, Go near and overtake this chariot.” (Acts 8:29)
- “Now there was a certain disciple at Damascus named Ananias; and to him the Lord said in a vision, Ananias. And he said, Here I am, Lord. So the Lord said to him, Arise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus, for behold, he is praying.” (Acts 9:10-11)
  - “came to me; and he stood and said to me, Brother Saul, receive your sight. And at that same hour I looked up at him.” (Acts 22:13)
- “And in a vision he [Saul] has seen a man named Ananias coming in and putting his hand on him, so that he might receive his sight.” (Acts 9:12)
- “About the ninth hour of the day he saw clearly in a vision an angel of God coming in and saying to him, Cornelius!...Now send men to Joppa, and send for Simon whose surname is Peter.” (Acts 10:3,5)
  - “And they said, Cornelius the centurion, a just man, one who fears God and has a good reputation among all the nation of the Jews, was divinely instructed by a holy angel to summon you to his house, and to hear words from you.” (Acts 10:22)
    - “Arise therefore, go down and go with them, doubting nothing; for I have sent them.” (Acts 10:20)
      - [God takes credit for sending the messengers from Cornelius](#)
  - “Four days ago I was fasting until this hour; and at the ninth hour I prayed in my house, and behold, a man stood before me in bright clothing” (Acts 10:30)
  - “He is lodging with Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the sea. He will tell you what you must do.” (Acts 10:6)
  - “who will tell you words by which you and all your household will be saved.” (Acts 11:14)
- “Peter went up on the housetop to pray, about the sixth hour. Then he became very hungry and wanted to eat; but while they made ready, he fell into a trance” (Acts 10:9,10)
  - “Now while Peter wondered within himself what this vision which he had seen meant” (Acts 10:17)
  - “I was in the city of Joppa praying; and in a trance I saw a vision, an object descending like a great sheet, let down from heaven by four corners; and it came to me.” (Acts 11:5)
- “While Peter thought about the vision, the Spirit said to him, Behold, three men are seeking you. Arise therefore, go down and go with them, doubting nothing; for I have sent them.” (Acts 10:19-20)
  - “Then the Spirit told me to go with them, doubting nothing. Moreover these six brethren accompanied me, and we entered the man’s house.” (Acts 11:12)
- “Then Barnabas departed for Tarsus to seek Saul. And when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch.” (Acts 11:25-26)
- “As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them. Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away.” (Acts 13:2-3)
- “And a vision appeared to Paul in the night. A man of Macedonia stood and pleaded with him, saying, Come over to Macedonia and help us. Now after he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go to Macedonia, concluding that the Lord had called us to preach the gospel to them.” (Acts 16:9-10)

- “But the following night the Lord stood by him and said, Be of good cheer, Paul; for as you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome.” (Acts 23:11)
- “I was in the Spirit on the Lord’s Day, and I heard behind me a loud voice, as of a trumpet, saying, I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, and, What you see, write in a book and send it to the seven churches which are in Asia: to Ephesus, to Smyrna, to Pergamos, to Thyatira, to Sardis, to Philadelphia, and to Laodicea. Then I turned to see the voice that spoke with me.” (Rev 1:10-12)
  - “The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants [doulos]” (Rev 1:1) – [God was sending servants to John to disseminate this Revelation from Jesus](#)
  - The content of the message: “who bore witness to the word of God, and to the testimony [maturia] of Jesus Christ, to all things that he saw.” (Rev 1:2)
  - “Write the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after this.” (Rev 1:19)
