Healing from Creativity Scars

The research participants could point to a specific incident where they were told or shown that they weren't good writers, artists, musicians, dancers, or something creative. Creativity Training:

- Self-Efficacy, the belief that I have choices and conceived outcomes, leads to Self-Motivation, the feeling I get
 when I feel that I have choices. Self-Motivation leads to Self-Responsiveness, which is the ability to ask myself, is
 this choice worth pursuing.
- Creativity fosters the belief in your own ability to change, which of course enhances your creativity. "You take on tougher challenges, persevere longer, and are more resilient through obstacles." [Creative Confidence by Tom Kelley and David Kelley, p. 37-39]
- A consistent flow of valuable ideas strengthens Self-Efficacy and leads to a more fulfilling life.
